- Research for white paper on strategic communications role of extension administrators: Ruth, Maria and Suzanne discussed the current report on the project, which was shared via e-mail to the group for review and feedback. This project is also suggested for distribution via Google Docs. Communication Skills in Extension Education is the new proposed title/direction. The plan is to have a draft of the white paper ready for peer review by the August meeting. Maria mentioned that she submitted a proposal to ACE to have a session that encourages dialogue about the topic and perhaps provides information that can be used as research for the paper; awaiting response from ACE. Next steps include survey development to determine current training and testing practices. Will provide progress report during next conference call in April.
- Update from PLC Representatives Frankie Gould and Ayanna McPhail, who attended the 2013 Planning Meeting in Atlanta, Dec. 5-6: Next PLN meeting will be held in Nashville Aug. 19-23. Theme is "Connecting with Communities: Preparing for the Next 100 Years." Frankie and Mr. Bill Woodrum, associate dean for Extension at WVSU, will present on the Smith-Lever anniversary at the meeting. Cross-committee sessions are being replaced by 90-minute topical sessions. Committee is asking that we submit action and information items prior to arrival of the meeting instead of at the end of the meeting. Frankie is working on keynote speaker options.
