- Resources regarding working with this particular population was sent via email
- Kansas has an established policy; CA, CO, and NH are currently working on a policy; most states are handling the matter of working with the population case by case basis

- It was recommended/encouraged by Mark Mains (KY) and Dr. Bonita Williams (NIFA) to eliminate the “Q” as a descriptor due to a perception of disrespect from mainstream
